WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, I issued a Public Health Disaster Emergency Declaration due to the imminent threat of a COVID-19 outbreak. That emergency declaration was extended by the Legislature, and expires on November 15, 2020;

WHEREAS, on November 6, 2020, Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS) Commissioner Adam Crum certified that an outbreak of the COVID-19 virus is occurring throughout Alaska, as evidenced by the current significant and widespread community transmission of the virus, including significant positive testing rates, and record daily numbers of new cases;

WHEREAS, on November 6, 2020, I issued a Public Health Disaster Emergency Declaration effective November 16, 2020, due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus in the State of Alaska;

WHEREAS, to minimize the spread of the COVID-19 virus, and to respond to the effects of the outbreak, I am issuing this Order based on my authority under the Public Health Disaster Emergency Declaration issued on November 6, 2020, and made effective on November 16, 2020;

The purpose of COVID-19 Outbreak Health Order No. 1, Suspensions of Sections of Alaska Administrative Code and Sections of Alaska Statutes, is to allow all state agencies to be able to administer their programs in a manner that best meets the needs of the state during the COVID-19 emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mike Dunleavy, Governor of the State of Alaska, pursuant to the authority vested in me under AS 26.23.020, am hereby issuing the following order.

IT IS SO ORDERED:

The State of Alaska is issuing COVID-19 Outbreak Health Order No. 1, Relating To The Suspension of Sections of Alaska Administrative Code and Sections of Alaska Statutes. This Order goes into effect at 12:01 am November 16, 2020.

Strict compliance with the statutes, regulations, and orders of state agencies as set forth in Appendix A to this Order, would prevent, impede, or delay actions necessary to cope with the COVID-19 Public Health Disaster Emergency, and that the language of each provision specified in Appendix A be suspended.

This Order, including the suspensions set forth in Appendix A to this Order, shall have the power of law, and shall supersede all conflicting laws during the duration of the Order. This Order is in effect for the duration of the Public Health Disaster Emergency Declaration, effective November 16, 2020 at 12:01 a.m. This Order may be amended, and additional Orders may be issued, to address mitigation efforts to control the spread of the COVID-19 virus.
