

ENTERING ALASKA BY LAND: COVID-19 PROTOCOLS



Alaska border crossings include Haines, Hyder, Skagway, and Little Gold (Tok) Alaska – as well as Beaver Creek in the Yukon Territory.

ESSENTIAL TRAVEL ONLY

Due to Canada's current travel restrictions for U.S. citizens, only essential road travel is allowed in or out of Alaska until further notice.

The Canadian government recognizes the following travel as essential:

- To college (with documentation and no escort)
- To a primary residence (with evidence of residency)
- To a new job (with proof of employment)
- Military deployment (with orders listing dependents if applicable)

IMPORTANT: All decisions to permit entry into Canada are made at the border on a case-by-case basis. You cannot confirm travel eligibility by phone.

If you are entering or leaving Alaska with a vehicle, alternatives to border crossing include travel on the Alaska Marine Highway System or ship your vehicle to the Lower 48.

TESTING REQUIREMENTS

Children 10 and under are exempt from testing requirements.

TESTING OPTION 1: BEFORE TRAVEL

- Take a qualifying COVID-19 test within 72 hours of departure.
- Upload negative COVID-19 results and complete the Travel Declaration Form in the Alaska Travel Portal before arrival at: alaska.covidsecureapp.com.

If you don't have your results, upload proof that you have taken your test. You will have to quarantine after your arrival at your own expense until a negative result is received.

- After uploading negative test results, observe strict social distancing for 5 days from your date of arrival.
- A second test taken between five and 14 days is recommended, but not required.

TESTING OPTION 2: AFTER TRAVEL

- Complete the Travel Declaration Form in the Alaska Travel Portal before you travel at: alaska.covidsecureapp.com.
- Upon arrival in Alaska, immediately continue to the nearest testing site. Locate testing sites online at: bit.ly/2L9b4fp
- Quarantine at your own expense until results are received.

- After uploading negative test results, observe strict social distancing for 5 days from your date of arrival.
- A second test taken between five and 14 days is recommended, but not required.

ALTERNATIVE TO TESTING

If you choose to not take a test, self-quarantine for 14 days at your own expense. This option is available only to Alaska residents with proof of residency.

CRITICAL WORKFORCE

Critical-infrastructure workforce employees must follow their employers' approved COVID-19 protective plans for both work-related and non-work-related travel to Alaska.
